As an international student or foreign national, you will generally need a visa for any length of time. Student visas are issued and regulated by Ministry of Interior and NGO Affairs, The Gambian Immigration Department. The process of obtaining a Student visa to study in The Gambia depends on the nationality of the student.

there are general requirements to gain entry into The Gambia, in addition to the specific requirements of each foreign national. In general you must be:

- Healthy Inoculations are required to enter the Gambia.
- 2. Law-abiding Criminal behavior is grounds for deportation.
- 3. Able to support yourself financially during your stay.
- 4. You intend to leave The Gambia after you complete your studies.

Students from ECOWAS countries listed above are required to pay 1,100 Dalasis (approximately US\$ 40) per year for the

duration of their full time studies at the University.

#### STUDENTS FROM NON ECOWAS COUNTRIES:

Students from all Non-ECOWAS countries are required to get approval from The Gambian Immigration Department to travel to The Gambia.

The University can obtain the approval on behalf of the student by paying a fee of 1000 Dalasis (approximately US\$ 36) prior to the student's arrival in The Gambia

Upon arrival, at the point of entry, the student shall be issued a student visas on payment of 1100 Dalasis (approximately US\$ 40) to the authorities.

So the Total cost of Student Visa ids \$ 76.00 per year.

#### Nursing Degree Learning Outcomes

The nursing process is the framework for clinical decision-making. Nurses holding the bachelors degree in nursing are prepared as accountable nursing care providers; they care for patients with common health problems in structured settings.

The scope of a graduate nursing practice centers on direct patient care and is defined by the roles of provider of care, manager of patient care, and member within the discipline of nursing.

The goal of the Bachelor of Science Nursing (BSN) Program at COLLEGE OF NURSING (CON) is the preparation of registered nurses to be able to provide direct patient care. This nursing care focuses on evidence-based knowledge, culturally relevant nursing values, and

accountable and responsible nursing skills or actions. The Program has adopted the National League for Nursing's Competency Statements for Nurses. The competency statements can be reviewed in the Evaluation of Clinical Competencies located at the back of this handbook. The Degree Nurse implements evidence based findings in the roles of provider of care, manager of care, and member within the discipline of nursing.

Graduates of the Degree Program are able to demonstrate the following learning outcomes:

- Act as provider of care, utilizing the five steps of the nursing process: assessment, diagnosis, planning, implementation, and evaluation.
- Demonstrate ability as a manager of care.
- Practice as a member within the discipline of nursing.
